




# SECRET GARDEN

The décor of the ceremony was selected to complement the

enchanting garden surroundings. The bride's favorite flowers hydrangeas, peonies, and table roses - were showcased in a classic color palette that blended neutral blushes, champagnes, and light pinks. To honor the different religious backgrounds of the couple, the service incorporated elements of both Christian and Jewish traditions and was officiated by both a rabbi and a reverend. 

Following a magnificent dinner, the couple cut their delicious wedding cake and listened to toasts presented in their honor. Aside from the traditional first dances, celebrating was intended to occur after dinner, inside the hotel. However, as it turned out, many attendees could not contain their excitement. "There was a great impromptu dance session outside under the stars during the final moments of the dinner," recalls the groom. "People couldn't resist starting to dance during the dinner portion because the music was so good," confirms the bride.

But there were more surprises yet to come.
